

Term 3: The Overthrow

Required Benchmark for Student:

Benchmark – SS.7HHK.3.7:

Analyze the roles of significant individuals (including King David Kalakaua, Robert Wilcox, Queen Lili'uokalani, Sanford Dole, Lorrin A. Thurston, and Minister Stevens) and groups (including Annexationist/Committee of Safety, Aloha Aina, and American businessman) and their involvement in the Overthrow.

Essential Questions:

1. How do people gain power, use it and influence others to do things?
2. How can one start or make a change to improve society?
3. How do you cope with (handle, or deal with) stress or when you feel threatened?
4. Should Hawaii still be a part of the United States today?

Unit overview:

The Overthrow marked the end of the Hawaiian monarchy. Queen Lili'uokalani would be the Hawaii's last monarch. In term 3, you will be learning about the events that led up to the Overthrow and the results. Students will need to know significant people and groups during this important event in Hawaiian history and explain their roles in it.
