On January 17, 1893, Queen Lili'uokalani was overthrown by the COPS (Committee of Public Safety). A provisional government led by Sanford B. Dole governed Hawaii. The President of the United States, Grover Cleveland has chosen you, Commissioner ______, to investigate the people involved in the Overthrow and the reasons why it occurred.

Your job is to find out whether the Overthrow was legal or illegal.

- 3. Picture of that person in your tree map
